WOW ALEX was a dynamic, multi-crusade campaign that formed part of the overall WOWZA initiative and targeted the Johannesburg township of Alexandra. Spanning over 800 hectares, it is home to hundreds of thousands of inhabitants and notorious for violence, addiction, and overcrowding. Eleven crusades were held—each over a minimum of three days—beginning in early February and concluding in mid-April.



Each weekend, a different section of Alex witnessed its own tailored crusade, ensuring easy accessibility for residents, transport being a massive problem faced on account of poverty and criminal activity. Some of the crusades were held among the dwellings in an inviting, open space. Others took place on a soccer field, school ground, or in a community hall. The schools were ministered in and aggressive street evangelism campaigns conducted. Relationships were forged between the pastors of Alex and evangelists with whom they can work together moving forward.



2-4 February

The WOW ALEX campaign launched with an impactful crusade led by Ev. Jabulani Ndaba, targeting Green House, Silver Town, Maponya Village and parts of Stjwetla, which lie in the far north of the township. Ev. Jabulani, saved in prison from a life of crime, delivered powerful messages of redemption and attendees responded passionately to the salvation altar calls. Wonderful healings were also reported and teachings were given by Ev. Tamryn Klintworth on the Holy Spirit.

Mrs. Mahomane had recently received the Lord as Savior but still struggled with past addictions and torments. "My body is vibrating," she testified. "I was living in darkness for such a long time but now, I see only the light of God!" She was also healed of knee issues that had made walking difficult. Itumeleng, aged 15, accepted Jesus during the crusade and was healed of unrelenting hand pain that had made writing at school impossible. Nomsa, 36, unemployed and mother of six, had been plagued by severe leg ailments which vanished after prayer. She can now care for her children and pursue employment.



9-11 February

Our next crusade took place in an area known as Extension 7. This crusade was housed in a tent and led by Evangelists Makwale Mangena and Khomotso Kgatla. Prior to the event, extensive street evangelism and school ministry set the stage for this soul-winning crusade.

The evangelistic duo passionately delivered messages on the significance of the blood of Jesus, the Samaritan woman, and the urgency of readiness for His return. Each service saw an overwhelming response, with attendees eagerly embracing the call to salvation and their details being recorded for follow-up by the local pastors.

Ev. Tamryn Klintworth presented teachings on the Holy Spirit on two consecutive evenings, enriching understanding of the Holy Spirit baptism and equipping believers to be used by God. The fervour of the local pastors, who returned night after night, underscored the success of this crusade. The services also included prayer for the sick, with numerous individuals testifying to healing and deliverance.



Elias, a truck driver, had suffered from an agonising, unremitting headache since last year, which disappeared during the crusade. Eliza, 43, was set free from years of feeling horrible burning and prickling sensations under her feet. Priscilla, 62, who endured a debilitating stroke and depression so violent that she had been institutionalised, was utterly liberated. We thank the Lord!





Holy havoc ruled throughout our third crusade, strategically nestled amid the dense dwellings of Tsutsumani. Despite the space constraints, the event saw a powerful turnout, with the local community eager to hear the Good News. Evangelists Bongani Mike Mhlongo and Jordan Dlodlo spearheaded this crusade, preaching passionate messages that resulted in many being saved. Sipho, a long-suffering alcoholic, was among those who found salvation. He was set free from the bonds of alcohol and requested prayer for a job. The very next day, he returned to testify: he had been offered a well-paying position by a reputable employer!



Prayer for the sick yielded many mighty miracles. Ellen, an elderly woman, was among those who was powerfully touched by the Lord. She had been reliant on a walker since 2021 due to a disc that had shifted in her spine. Now, the pain has left and all mobility has fully returned. Boni, 62, had fallen badly some time ago and was reliant on painkillers. "My body was in agony, even with the medication," she expressed. "During this crusade, I experienced heaven on earth. I am healed. The pain is gone!" The crusade concluded with Ev, Samuel Murrombe teaching on the Holy Spirit, leaving the community empowered for great and mighty works of their own. Hallelujah!





23-25 February

Evangelist Elias Mphasha led a transformative crusade in an area renowned for its drug activity. He preached the Gospel with passion and power, while Evangelists Tamryn Klintworth and Samuel Murrombe taught on the Holy Spirit, setting believers ablaze for evangelism.

Pinky, a 32-year-old wife and mother of five children was among those saved. "I have been addicted to alcohol for many years. I am always drunk and it affects my husband and children," she shared. Receiving Jesus as Saviour, she was slain in the Spirit during prayer. "I woke up on the floor. I feel full of peace and joy. I will not touch alcohol again. Jesus is my Lord!" she proclaimed with great enthusiasm.



Many other testimonies were heard of deliverance and healing. Zanele, 59, suffered a stroke five years ago. "I could not do anything for myself," she voiced. Now, she is well. Betty, a 55-year-old cleaner, not only received Jesus as Saviour but was liberated from all-pervasive body pains that doctors had not been able to diagnose and that make working extremely difficult. How marvellous!





River Park is a recent extension of Alex township, lying along its most south-eastern border. The location of this crusade was ideal, being right in amongst the residences. Evangelists Aryn de Fin and Samuel Murrombe preached boldy and every altar call for salvation resulted in a terrific response. Precious people poured forward to call on the name of the Lord, some smelling strongly of alcohol—even with beers still in hand! Ev. Tamryn Klintworth preached on the Holy Spirit baptism and how God wants to use every one of His children as witnesses, with signs and wonders following.



Many testified of how the power of the Lord had impacted them. Marobela, 36, a cleaner by occupation, had been overwhelmed by depression and suicidal thoughts for several years. "Even today, I was thinking about committing suicide," she voiced. Hearing that Jesus died for her, she accepted Him as Saviour. "I feel so alive now! I am full of hope for the future!" she testified. Abel, 32, no longer needs to use a catheter to relieve himself after receiving prayer. Ethel, 67, suffered from intense pains in her womb for the past three years. Now, all pain has vanished!





Our sixth crusade in Alex was held at the KwaBhekilanga Rugby Ground and spearheaded by Ev. Emmanuel Popela. Over four glorious services, heaven touched earth. Evangelists Popela and Murrombe preached the Gospel, declaring the saving power that Jesus freely shows towards all who call upon His matchless name! Every altar call made resulted in many pouring forward to confess their belief in Jesus. The Holy Spirit baptism was also taught on and prayed for, as well as the sick.



Testimonies were heard in abundance. Charmaine, 28, battled with severe headaches and suicidal thoughts. "I would hear voices telling me to kill myself," she explained. Now, the thoughts have stopped, the depression has lifted and the headaches have ceased. Fikile, 59, started feeling extremely fatigued six months ago. "I could not do anything for myself and the doctors could not help me," he pronounced. Since prayer, Fikile is full of energy. Thabiso, age 40 and the father of five children, started having chest pains eight years ago that recently became worse and worse. Since attending the crusade, the pains have completely stopped. "I feel free, at peace and empowered. God is with me and I will live for Him!" he shared. We thank the Lord!



Evangelists Lindiwe Dhlamini and Rochelle Hicks laboured to impact the section of the township that was assigned to them. They worked tirelessly and diligently, ministering anywhere and everywhere, from schools and the neighbourhood police station to an initiation home—where a group of witchdoctors gave their lives to Jesus! The crusade itself was held on the grounds of a local establishment that is a hotspot for secular entertainment. The Gospel was preached and both young and old surrendered all to Jesus. The sick were prayed for and mighty miracles manifested. The Holy Spirit baptism was taught on and believers were empowered to be witnesses of His greatness and glory.



Margret is a 65-year-old grandmother. She was set free from terrible pains under her feet that had made walking extremely difficult for the past three years. Owotuu is nine years old. Since the age of two, she has been unable to hear out of her one ear. She received Jesus as her Lord and Saviour and then, during prayer for the sick, her deaf ear popped open! Wendy, 39, suffered a stroke in 2017 and was reliant on a crutch, her one leg weak and unresponsive. Now, strength and mobility have flooded back into that leg. Overjoyed, Wendy praised the Lord.



22-24 March

The eighth crusade was held on a well-known sports ground, west of the Juskei River. Surrounded by shebeens and a general buzz of worldliness, it was a terrific spot to pitch a tent and preach Jesus! Evangelists Thurston Meyer and Samuel Murrombe preached the Gospel, while Ev. Tamryn Klintworth taught on the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Over three glorious days, the lost were saved, sick healed, captives liberated and believers filled with the Spirit.



Masego, 35, had been an avid soccer player until five years ago when her knees began hurting so dreadfully that she was forced to give up her passion. Attending the crusade, she first asked Jesus to be her Lord. Then, she went forward for prayer for healing. "I felt God touching me," she voiced. "I have not felt this before. I am not used to prayer. The pain has left my knees. I feel like a new person!" Mashudu is a 41-year-old mother of four children. A few months ago, she had a stroke and the effects continued plaguing her. She felt weak and slow, tired and unbalanced. She had not been able to return to work. During prayer, the Lord touched her body. "Every bad thing that I was feeling left. It was like something was removed from me. I feel so happy! God is faithful!"











This crusade was excellently orchestrated by Evangelists Neo Makhubo and Deborah Mafujane. Such was held at a venue positioned at the entrance of a large hostel for women and in amongst all the hustle and bustle of township nightlife. While the weather was cold and wet, the spiritual atmosphere was hot—hot with Holy Spirit firepower! A tent sheltered an eager crowd from the elements and an enthusiastic sound system blasted the Good News far and wide. Both evangelists, together with Ev. Samuel Murrombe, preached terrific salvation sermons and taught on the Holy Spirit baptism.



Marvellous testimonies were heard, including those of Nkele and Bembo. Nkele is a 34-year-old beauty therapist and mother of three children. Her sister invited her to the crusade and she responded to the altar call for salvation on the first night and asked Jesus to be her Lord. She went forward for prayer for the sick as well, being plagued by perpetual, acute pains in her womb. The next day, she came to testify that those pains had vanished. Bembo is a 63-year-old grandfather. For the past four months, he had been tormented by nightmares of witchdoctors and demons. Since he started attending the crusade meetings, the horrible dreams have stopped and he has felt only peace. Bembo is ecstatic. "I thank Jesus for setting me free!" he voiced.



12-14 April

Our penultimate crusade was held in the north-western segment of Alex, known as Marlboro. It was headed up by Ev. Stephanie Ngcobo, an Alex resident, and held on an open piece of ground outside a local clinic. While the weather was chilly, precious people came in great numbers, bedecked in beanies and blankets. The atmosphere was exceedingly joyous. What praise! What dancing! The Lord was zealously magnified and His matchless name adored. Evangelists Stephanie and Samuel preached the Gospel and the response was tremendous. Ev. Tamryn Klintworth taught on the Holy Spirit, equipping those in attendance to witness for Jesus with signs and wonders following. In every meeting, the sick were prayed for and those in need of deliverance.



Mokiki is a 48-year-old business owner. She had been involved in two accidents and was confined to a wheelchair. During the praise and worship, she felt such a desire to jump up and join in the dancing that she did just that and as she danced, the pain disappeared! Elated, Mokiki was thrilled. "I just want to thank God!" she expressed. Percy, a 28-year-old butchery worker and Kgolotelo, a 30-year-old mother of three, had been suffering from deep depression. During prayer, both were liberated. "We feel so loved! We feel such peace!" they related. Felicia, 46, had battled with shortness of breath for the past several years. She could not walk further than a short distance, without needing to stop and rest. Now, her lungs are open and her energy levels have soared. Jane is a 64-yearold widow and tea lady. She had suffered a stroke six months ago and found it difficult to walk, her right side being painful and awkward. After prayer, Jane is ecstatic. "I feel completely well!" she declared, glorifying the Lord.





The final crusade was a triumph! It was held in a large, well-known hall that forms part of a stadium compound and is situated in the centre of the township. Evangelists Phil and Dinah Madua were responsible for this event, a dynamic husband and wife team and celebrated Gospel artists. Over the three days, Evangelists Phil Madua and Samuel Murrombe preached the Gospel while Ev. Tamryn Klintworth taught on the Holy Spirit. Precious people responded eagerly to every altar call for salvation. Believers were equipped to share Jesus with signs and wonders following. Hands were laid on the sick and those in need of deliverance.

Khuthala is a 50-year-old cleaner. Since 2019, she has been coughing incessantly and battling to breathe. Medication did not help. During prayer, she was overcome by the power of God. Since then, all coughing has ceased and she can breathe easily. Masiego, 36, has been attending the crusades since the eighth one. There, she received the Lord as Saviour. For the past five years, she has been an alcoholic. "I would get up at 5am and start drinking immediately," this dear woman shared. "All the shebeen owners knew me." Now, Masiego is free! She has not touched alcohol for weeks. Her heart is filled with joy and her mind with peace. Benny, 43, has been addicted to drugs and drink for the past twenty years. He asked Jesus to be his Saviour at this crusade. "I feel the presence of God!" he exclaimed. "God touched me and now I have peace within me." Ntswake is a young woman who had recently been initiated as a witchdoctor. She attended the crusade and surrendered her life to Jesus. She brought her witchcraft paraphernalia to be burned. "God is great!" she pronounced. "I give my life to Him!"





## TOUCHING A NATION

The remaining 32 crusades were spread across the Western Cape, Northern Cape, Free State, Limpopo, and Gauteng provinces. The events were held in both urban and rural areas and each involved numerous churches, these pastors being responsible for following up those who received Jesus as Saviour. From coastal towns and mining communities to remote villages and city townships, every location was prayerfully chosen and desperately in need of a touch from God. In the build-up to each event, believers were trained for evangelism and outreaches were held in the schools and on the streets. Tens of thousands were saved, broken bodies healed and bondages broken. Christians were set ablaze for soul-winning and communities overwhelmed by the love of God.























#### CHAMPIONING THE LOCAL EVANGELIST

This strategy of empowering local evangelists through mentorship and financial support to hold outreaches in their own communities is pivotal for transforming any nation. 









































## HEARTFELT THANKS
